BMW Recall

BMW has announced the recall of its R-Series Boxer-Twin and K 1200 GT motorcycles after a potential fault in a brake pipe was detected. The affected units include the ones manufactured between August 2006 and May 2009.

The company has identified a risk of leaks in the braking system of its K 1200 GT motorcycles and other models built on the same base. In its official statement, BMW explained that it was possible that vibrations on affected motorcycles could cause the front brake pipe to leak and, over an extended period of time, brake fluid to escape.

"In the event of this happening, riders will notice the leaking brake fluid or a reduction in the brake fluid level in the handlebar mounted brake fluid reservoir. This may result in a gradual loss of braking performance of the front brake. The rear brake is not affected."

No accidents have been reported so far because of the issue. Sources close to the matter state that the recently issued recall notice might involve some 122,000 units worldwide.

Lessons learned:


Have earplugs in the tent.

BMW Adventure Ride, Bybee, TN

The weather was good when I left home Friday afternoon for Bybee, TN for the Saturday, April 17 Adventure Ride. I had communicated with Harry and Ron about meeting them there. They were going to trailer their bikes (650 X-Country and F800GS) and I wanted to ride (R1200GS) down. Any way to add mileage to the GS's odometer you know. I'm desperate to beat that Jones guy some year in the mileage contest.



I was fortunate to have looked at the flyer's navigation directions as my Garmin MapSource had chosen a different Bybee, TN. There are three Bybees in Tennessee. It was just short of 300 miles getting to the sign in location. It was a Strange person who promoted the event. His name, John Strange, seemed strange to me, but he was as nice as could be and put on a good event. Harry and Ron rolled in shortly after me and we all signed up and did a little bit of pre ride bench wrenching or BSing before heading back to the Motel 8 camping facility.

It was cloudy and threatening rain as we started out on our 179.4 mile route and stayed that way as we meandered generally southward on primarily narrow paved and unpaved roads including a short section of the Foothills Parkway on the eastern border of Smoky Mountain NP. There was quite a variety of bikes-GSs, KLRs, XRs, V-Stroms, even an old two stroke. We passed through Maggie Valley and got to within 10 miles of the Blue Ridge Motorcycle Campground. I thought about my diesel experience there several years ago. After a lunch break our smaller group resumed following the route and, as I was the only one with a roll chart, I was in the lead. Unfortunately, I took I-40 eastward instead of westward and after several miles to the next exit we stopped to discuss and several wanted to give up trying to complete the route. So we decided to follow the GPS's quickest route back to the starting point.

Well the calculated way was I-40 westward and we breezed along until coming to the road closed signs. Remember the rock slide on I-40? A NC Trooper told us how we could go on several more exits then follow a difficult 12 mile gravel road to get around the blockage. That road was not on my GPS and most roads are - even some which can't be ridden. We followed his instructions and did get back about 5 PM. The dinner provided by Mr. Strange was great and the beer helped it slide down so smoothly. After several hours of bench riding it was time for bed.

My return ride was great but it started off with a scare. On US-25e at about 65 MPH I saw a turkey starting to run and it struggled to fly. Turkeys take off like B-52s -very slow ascent. I ducked as low as I could and just missed it.

The return ride highlight was the stretch of KY-89 between McKee and Irvine. I got home feeling good about completing my first Adventure Ride. There were only thirteen more days to go before the Renfro Valley Dual Sport Ride.

Testing the 3rd wheel.

I visited Middletown Cycle to test ride the Can Am Spyder RT & RS. I signed the waiver, and after a short overview of the RT by Chris, I was off on my ride. I turned down the radio to hear the 990 cc Rotax twin, and set the adjustable windshield to its lowest position so I could look over rather than through it. This model had no clutch and shifting was done with your left thumb and index finger. There is a re-



verse gear also. The brake pedal applies braking to all wheels and felt unfamiliar without my right hand. I went along straight and then my first curve I slowed down and steered while leaning into the curve to fight the centrifugal forces. It was like riding a 4 wheeler, but very planted. And, very twitchy in the curves and even in the straight aways, I felt like I could not let go and go perfectly straight. Too much contact patch made for a ride full of work. Maybe the ride gets better with a little tire wear.



Next I rode the RS that had the familiar clutch and gear shifter. The RS is slightly more foreword riding and leaning your body into curves is easier, but it still has the same ride characteristics as the RT. I got it up to 70 mph and it was pretty stable, as I pressed my curve entry speed, timing the turn is key. I found myself turning too soon and riding the white line. I never felt any loss of traction or tipping sensations. The Spyder to me felt like a 4-wheeler or a car more than a bike. It does attract attention, but it comes with a hefty price tag starting at 16k and going up to 23k.

The next day I went to Midwest Polaris and test rode the Piagio MP3 500ie. Maneuvering the 500 cc scooter out of the showroom seemed easy to the owner with the fixed wheel lock in use. He goes through the controls as I straddle the scooter, still in its locked position. The start button fires up the big scooter and with another press of a button the wheels are unlocked and I instantly feel the wheels free to lean. A twist of the throttle and away I go. The brakes are on the handlebars. Left controls the rear, right controls the front two wheels. They are very strong together and stopping would be no problem. I find rt 222 in Batavia and head south to see how this baby handles in the curves. I instantly had a huge grin, as I was able to enjoy the lean of the bike rather than my body to stay on. The automatic transmission was very smooth and delivered ample torque and acceleration,

which meant I could focus on enjoying the smooth ride and push my cornering speeds. The ergonomics were just a little cramped for me but it still was a blast. As I came back to the dealership I tested the wheel locking feature as I came to a stop a light comes on signifying that the lock can be applied. With a press of a button the wheels are locked, I hear a beep signifying the wheels are locked, as I come to a stop to turn left. With my feet on the floor boards, I wait for the traffic before I give it gas, and the lock releases as I turn left. Very cool.

At half the price of the base Spyder RS, the MP3 has my vote. Maybe I will try the new Harley Trike


