www.hillbillyhotdogs.com has been featured on both DDD with Guy and also on the Travel Channel's "Massive Meals". There are three locations now: the original at Lesage, WV, the second in Huntington and the new one in Chesapeake, OH. We went to the one in Huntington.

Mom and I left Forest Park at 9 AM and travel I-275 W to US 52 exit for New Richmond. Following US 52 East through Ripley, Portsmouth, and Ironton OH we merged onto Highway 7 to cross the Ohio River into Huntington, WV. After following 4th Ave. East until it dead-ended at Marshall University; then left for a block; left again onto 3rd Ave. and one block to the home of Hillbilly Hot Dogs on the next corner on the left. We arrived about 1 PM.

There is seating for about 30 to 34 people inside and maybe 10 outside. Plenty of parking can be had in the back and a few spaces on the side, but none on 3rd. Ave.

We missed the lunch crowd and there was only one couple inside and two men on the patio. We were greeted as soon as we arrived and given menus. The menu is impressive! A tri-fold 8 1/2 by 11 sheet printed on both sides; the inside is the menu. I counted 29 hot dogs, 2 steaks, 6 chickens, 3 salads, 12 sides, 5 subs, and burgers from 4 oz. to **30 pounds!** Yes, **30 pounds!** There is also the "Home Wrecker" hot dog at **3 pounds** total. And then there are 17 "fried fixins" and other stuff.

Mom had the "hillbilly Dog" with mustard, deep fried. I had the same with mustard, onions, and sauce, deep fried. Mom had french fries and I had onion rings. Every thing was good. It was well worth the trip. Mom says we're going back to try one of the burgers.

On leaving we were headed south on the street that runs in front of Marshall University to pickup I-64 when we passed an open "FrostTop" drive-in. I have not seen a "FrostTop" in 40+ years. They have really great root beer! So that is another reason to head back to Huntington.

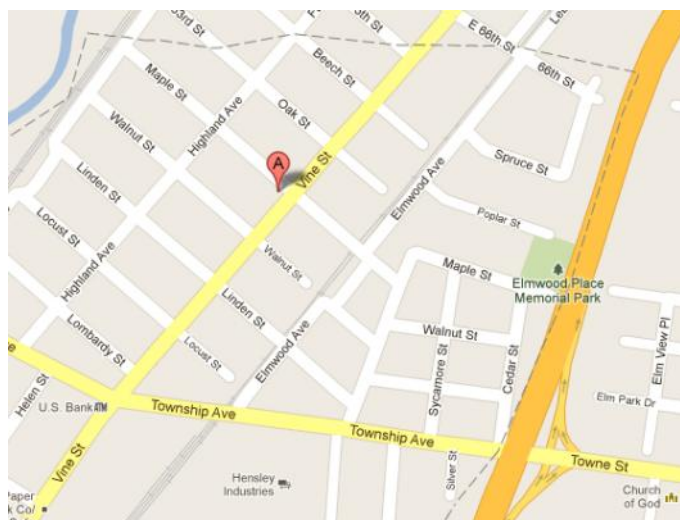

A few weeks back Kim and her mother went to a quarter auction benefiting the Cincinnati Association for the Blind. The auction was held in Elmwood Place or St. Bernard by her blind sister at one of the municipal buildings over there. Kim didn't win one prize at the auction. Her prize came a week later

A week ago I received a letter from the police department processing center in Lanham, Maryland. I open it up thinking this was a mistake and it's a "Notice of Liability" from the village of Elmwood Place, with pictures of our car and a close up of our license plate. Kim got busted Big Brother style going 33 in a 25 mph zone. I'm surprise she didn't get one coming back. I did some research and read of a Catholic Church that on one Sunday robo cop handed out tickets to 70 members of the congregation. Some of the locals got 7 or 8 tickets in the mail before they knew what was going on. The Elmwood Police Department is making lots of money now, (20,000 tickets in the first two weeks) and if you want to fight it, you have to go to Cleveland. That's where they want you to send your \$105 to. The camera owner in MD gets almost half of this. The processing center in Cleveland gets a cut and the rest goes to the damned village. Meanwhile the businesses nearby are suffering as many have boycotted the area. There is such an outrage over these tickets I'm considering not paying it and see what happens. 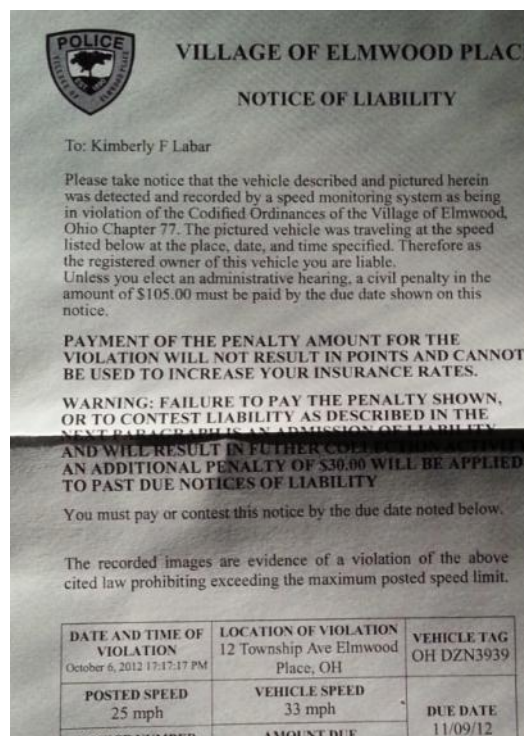

Irresistible Pecan Pie

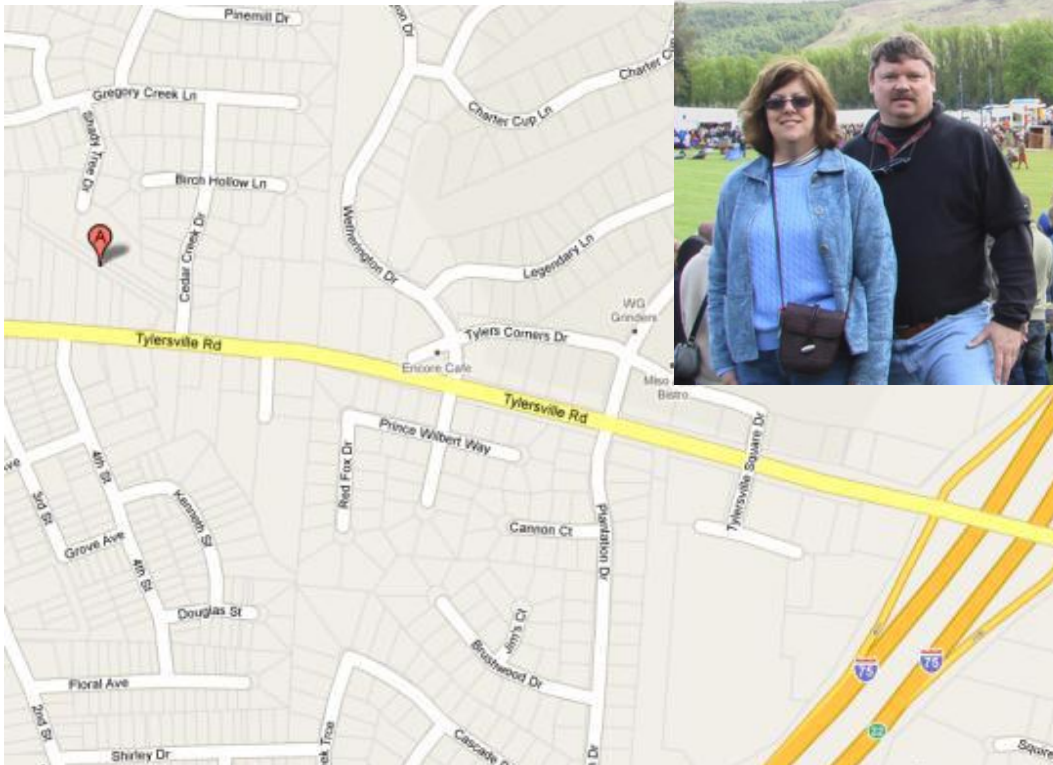


1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 2 tablespoons white sugar
 1/2 cup butter, chilled
 4 tablespoons ice water
 3 eggs, beaten
 3/4 cup light corn syrup

2 tablespoons dark corn syrup
 3/4 cup light brown sugar
 3 tablespoons butter, melted
 1 pinch salt
 1/2 cup pecans, finely crushed
 1 cup pecans, quartered
 1 cup pecan halves

Directions

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).
2. To Make Crust: In a medium bowl, combine flour, salt and white sugar. Cut butter into flour mixture until it resembles coarse crumbs. Gradually sprinkle the water over the dry mixture, stirring until dough comes together enough to form a ball.
3. On a floured surface flatten dough ball with rolling pin. Roll out into a circle that is one inch larger than pie dish. Place pie sheet in pie dish and refrigerate until pie filling is complete.
4. To Make Pie Filling: In a medium bowl, mix together eggs, light and dark corn syrups, brown sugar, butter, salt and finely crushed pecans. Spread quartered pecans over bottom of refrigerated pie crust. Pour syrup mixture over top of pecans, then arrange pecan halves on top of pie.
5. Bake in a preheated 350 degrees F (175 degrees C) oven for one hour or until firm; let cool for one hour before serving.
